



Description of the setup process (preliminary)


Teacher

<u>Student</u>


The student installs Cisco Webex Meetings on their iPad/tablet without having to create a Webex account

Setup for the teacher (1/2)




Click "activate" in the welcome email

Setup for the teacher (2/2)





Teacher login


Launch the Webex Meetings app on your PC and log in using your Webex credentials (email address and password)









Lesson in progress... (teacher side)


... clicking on "Start Meeting" (see slide above) starts the video preview to allow the teacher to verify that his video is ok izwan nizal













Lesson control (for the teacher)


Lesson control

The teacher can, through the list of participants, mute and possibly even expel the students individually




Locking the lesson (closing the "door")

The teacher can, at any time, block access to the Personal Room by preventing additional participants (e.g. students of a different class) from entering. In the same way, the teacher can unlock it at any time.



End the lesson

- Only the teacher can finish the lesson.
- The teacher is also entitled to leave the Personal Room without the lecture ending, but in this case he will have to indicate another participant to take the lead on his/her behalf.
